

The Regular Council Meeting was called to order by Mayor Bruce Armstrong at 7:01 p.m. in the Haysville Municipal Building, 200 West Grand Avenue.

Roll was taken by Recording Secretary Ginger Cullen: Kessler here, Kanaga here, B. Rardin here, Ewert here, Benner here, J. Rardin here, Crum here, Thompson here.

Invocation was given by Councilperson Dan Benner.

Mayor Bruce Armstrong led everyone present in the Pledge of Allegiance.

Under Presentation and Approval of Minutes, Mayor Bruce Armstrong presented for approval the Minutes of September 14th, 2015.

Motion by Kessler – Second by B. Rardin

I make a motion that we approve the minutes from September 14th, 2015.

Under Citizens to be Heard, Mayor Bruce Armstrong introduced the Sedgwick County Fire Department. Lieutenant Dustin Goetz reviewed recent activities of Fire Station 34.

There were no Licenses or Bonds.

There were no Ordinances or Resolutions

Under Notices and Communications, Mayor Bruce Armstrong called for Governing Body Announcements. Councilperson Russ Kessler thanked those who attended the ribbon cutting at Kirby Park. He showed a video of the ceremony. Kessler also advised a new swing set was installed at Riggs Park and a fishing dock is being installed at Riggs Lake on October 3rd. Kessler advised a fishing dock will be installed at Old Oaks Lake in November. Councilperson Steve Crum advised the Friends of the Library would be hosting a Mystery Dinner Theatre on October 9th and 10th. Crum gave other library updates and advised Campus High School varsity football currently had a record of 2-3. He stated the Homecoming Parade would be on October 2nd at 2:00 p.m. and the football game would be at 7:00 p.m. Mayor Bruce Armstrong advised City Attorney Alison McKenney-Brown and Chief Administrative Officer attended a Sheriff's auction and were able to purchase 43 lots on behalf of the city land bank for about \$2,600. Mayor Armstrong advised that by purchasing these lots, the City will be able to sell them and get back the money from special assessments.

Under Notices and Communications, Mayor Bruce Armstrong presented a Memo to Council Regarding New Business.

There was no Old Business.

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Under Other Business, Mayor Bruce Armstrong presented Consideration of Patrol Vehicle Purchase. Police Chief Jeff Whitfield reviewed details of the request and answered questions posed by Council.

Motion by Crum – Second by Ewert

I'll go ahead and make a motion that we approve to get the new vehicles at \$52,984.00 from Shawnee Mission Ford for the new police vehicles.

Chief Administrative Officer Will Black had nothing to report.

City Clerk Janie Cox advised City offices would be closed on October 12th and the next council meeting would be on October 13th. Cox also advised the drive through would be closed on October 12th as the window would be repaired.

Police Chief Jeff Whitfield stated the visiting officer was Sergeant Rene LaMarche. He also stated the drug take back on September 26th served about 45 citizens and collected 98.8 pounds of used, unwanted and expired drugs. Councilperson Steve Crum asked what the route of the Homecoming parade would be. Chief Whitfield advised it would begin at Haysville West Middle School and continue east on Grand to Main, where it would turn north and finish at Homeland. He also advised it would begin at 2:00 and citizens should plan for traffic delays.

Public Works Director Randy Dorner stated the Sarah Lane sidewalk project was complete except where Westar needs to move poles and guy wires. He stated the next projects would be at Plagens Carpenter and north Main sidewalks. Dorner also advised the final inspection on the Baughman and Alice project occurred and the grading would have to be corrected.

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Recreation Director Georgie Carter gave details of upcoming Activity Center events including youth basketball sign ups, S.O.S. days on October 9th, 15th, and 16th, and a hunter safety course on November 6th and 7th.

There were no Appointments.

There were no Off Agenda Citizens to be Heard.

There was no Executive Session.

Under Bills to be Paid, Mayor Bruce Armstrong presented the Bills to be Paid for the Last Half of September.
